I co-authored the training (Treatnet Family) PowerPoint (with Dr. Natasha Slesnick) and pilot tested the resulting United Nations Family Therapy (UNFT) model in Jakarta, Indonesia in November, 2018. Relatedly, I wrote in 2019 the UNFT therapist manual to accompany the Treatnet Family training PowerPoint. In 2019, as part of a feasibility study, I co-led another week-long UNFT training workshop in Jakarta, Indonesia, this time, for local Indonesian therapists. In addition, I provided long-distance meta-supervision for the local supervisors of Indonesian therapists providing UNFT.
